CLASSROOM REMINDERS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

ECS – GRADE 2

I hope everyone has a fruitful month of March as we prepare our hearts for Easter. Thank you to all the parents for dressing up the students in occupation costumes for our 100th Day Class Party. And thank you for your prompt response and dedication for supporting students' trips to the pools.

ECS:

Language Arts - We are continuing to read Level A books. Students are learning to recognize their sight words in picture books. We are continuing to learn digraphs. In handwriting, we have finished learning all uppercase letters. We have started to practice lowercase letters. Students are learning to practice writing sentences using finger spaces. We are also learning how to tell stories through play. Children are very imaginative, and they have come up with very interesting stories!

In **Math**, we are practicing addition within 10. We are also learning how to count to 100.

In **PE**, we are going swimming. Thank you for preparing your child for swimming.

In **Music**, we are practicing choreography for the Spring Banquet.

Grade 1-2

Language Arts - We have been learning how to write poems. We will continue to work on poem writing by focusing on small moments with big feelings.

Math – We are continuing to practice addition and subtraction within 100.

Science – We are starting the Magnetism unit. We will be learning all about magnets and attraction. We will also learn all about what God is attracted to.

Social – We are learning about Meteghan, Nova Scotia. We recently had Tanner's family members visit us to teach us about trapping. Please ask your child about all the animals we got to see.

In **PE**, we are going swimming. Thank you for preparing your child for swimming.

In **Music**, we are practicing choreography for the Spring Banquet.

GRADES 3 – 6

Math:

The **Grade 3s** are mid-way through their unit on division and will move from division to learning about fractions. Keep your eye out for a pizza fractions project that will be coming home mid-March.

The **Grade 4s** will continue to learn about fractions and will move from fractions to decimals later this month. Keep your eye out for a pizza fractions project that will be coming home mid-March.

The **Grade 5s** are also learning fractions and will have a pizza fractions project coming later this month; once they are finished their fractions unit, they will move on to decimals. They will finish the month with a unit that shows the practical application of decimals in life.

The **Grade 6s** are beginning a unit on multiplying and dividing decimals and will finish the month with looking at percentages and ratios. The Grade 6s will also have a pizza project coming this month, but it will relate to ratios and percentages.

LA: We will be wrapping up report writing and will move into a story writing unit for the duration of March. The students will continue with cursive writing, spelling, and working towards their reading challenge.

Science: We have been learning about electricity and magnetism; we have learned about safety and various types of circuits, conductors, and insulators, etc. The class has been participating in a Canada-wide energy classroom challenge and we will continue to do extra activities that examine energy sources and proper stewardship of Canada's energy resources. We also have an in-house field trip with the *Telus World of Science* in Edmonton; we will be learning about making electric cars! The kits have arrived, and the class is eagerly looking forward to this activity, as am I.

In **Social Studies**, we are wrapping up our study of Canada's physical geography and natural resources; we will begin looking at the stories of Canadians, starting with Confederation up to the turn of the century. Then we will look at Canada's involvement in World War 1 and the changes that resulted because of it.

In **Bible** we will be looking at how historical context and cultural context impacts the interpretation of Scripture.

GRADES 7 - 9

Grade 7-9s:

In **Bible** we have just started our study of the Biblical Worldview of Economics; we are focusing on the question: how should we use our resources? There are some difficult concepts taught in this unit; it may be useful to discuss them with your students. Economics, free exchange, socialism, capitalism, stewardship, and social welfare are all key terms for this unit. The key idea of this unit is: private ownership provides incentives for better stewardship and leads to economic advancement. Every student will benefit from discussions on these concepts, especially from a Biblical perspective.

In **Social Studies**, we are learning about what drove Canada to Confederation. We will be studying Sir John A Macdonald as well as other key figures in Confederation. We will also be asking what is responsible government and how was Canada's government formed? From there, we will begin to study the Red River Métis and Louis Riel.

Grade 7

LA – Students have finished their short story unit and will be working on poetry this month.

Math – Grade 7 students will be completing multiple units in math including: probability and data management, patterns and algebra and a unit about integers.

Science – We are currently learning about Earth.

Grade 8

LA – We are working on our poetry unit.

Math – Students will be covering multiple units including patterns and algebra, measurement, and probability and data management.

Science – The month of March will be spent learning about light and optical systems.

Grade 9

LA – Grade 9 students will be reading Shakespeare’s play *The Taming of the Shrew*.

Math – Students will be writing a practice PAT Friday, March 5. It is for marks so please encourage your child to study for it. The rest of the month will be spent covering similarity and transformations.

Science - March will see students completing their unit on electricity and likely will start their 5th unit on space exploration.
