### CLASSROOM REMINDERS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

#### ECS – GR 2

October has already gone by! In the month of October, we have made a lot of progress. As the cold winter looms, I hope that everyone stays healthy and safe with God’s protection. Thank you to all the parents for guiding students to success.

#### ECS:

**LA:** We have continued to learn letter sounds. Please continue to review the sounds with the children at home using the Sound Book.

**Social:** We have learned about the concept of “me”.

**Math:** We have learned to count to 20. We will continue to practice number recognition. Since the last week of October, we started to learn about shapes.

**Science:** We will be discovering awareness of objects and events through themes. For the month of October, the theme was fall. Please ask your child about how his/her scarecrow was created! For the month of November, the theme will be about Remembrance Day.

**PE:** We have practiced kicking the ball. We also practiced locomotive skills such as galloping, hopping and skipping. Please ask your child to demonstrate.

**Music:** We have recently started to practice for the Christmas production.

#### GR 1-2:

**LA:** We have made progress in stretching out details in our stories. Students are learning to add details in stories by stretching out small moments.

**Social:** We have been learning about the Iqaluit, Nunavut.

**Math:** We have been learning about patterns. Students have learned to identify the core, describe the pattern rule and to extend the patterns. Students really enjoyed this unit!

**Science:** We have been working on different projects like our Hot and Cold Safety poster and we have each designed and built a thermos of our own to apply and test our knowledge of insulation. We also learned that God is in control of the weather.

**PE:** We have practiced kicking the ball. We also practiced locomotive skills such as galloping, hopping and skipping. Please ask your child to demonstrate.

**Music:** We have recently started to practice for the Christmas production.

### GR 3-6

In **LA** we will continue our novel study, *Number the Stars* by Lois Lowry. We will continue to work on spelling and typing as well as building our grammar knowledge.

In **Math**, the Grade 3s will wrap up their unit on measurement and then begin to study patterns; while the grade 4s will also study patterns and then Multiplication. The grade 5s will continue with Division and then move into a unit on patterns, and the grade 6s will focus on patterns and algebra.

In **Science**, we will begin a new unit on weather; we will study clouds, air pressure, wind speeds, and much more.

In **Social Studies** we will continue to study the Great Lakes/ St. Lawrence Lowlands region of Canada's geography. During the week of November 9- 13<sup>th</sup> we will take time to study a little about World War 1. The Canadian War Museum sends out boxes of historical artifacts for students to explore and study; the students will have opportunities that week to learn more about Canada's role in the war.

In **Bible** we are learning about the importance of knowing the truth and living out our faith, while learning to study the Bible. We have been learning to ask the 5 Ws and H questions, to take notes and to look for key words

while studying God's word. We have been applying these skills to the book of Titus.

### GR 7-9

#### Gr 9

**LA** –The students are completing a short grammar unit before starting their short stories unit.

**Science** – The students are wrapping up their unit on biological diversity and will be starting a unit on matter and chemical change.

**Math** - The new unit we are entering is on rational numbers.

#### Gr 8

**LA** – We have started a unit on short stories.

**Math** – The students are finishing a unit on patterns and algebra before starting another number sense unit.

**Science** – This month we will complete the unit on mix and flow of matter and start a new unit about cells and systems.

#### Gr 7

**LA** – We are still working on our novel and film study about Voyage of the Dawn Treader by C.S. Lewis.

**Math** – The students will wrap up their unit on factors, multiples and fractions about mid-November and will start a unit about geometry. Your child will need a geometry set for this unit if they do not already have one.

**Science** – We are nearly done our unit on structures and will begin a unit about heat and temperature.

#### Gr 7-9

In **Bible**, we will finish our unit on the Biblical worldview of sociology; then we will move into our unit on the Biblical worldview of law.

In **Social Studies** we will be studying how the British came and colonized Canada. During the week of November 9- 13<sup>th</sup> we will take time to study a little about World War 1. The Canadian War Museum sends out boxes of historical artifacts for students to explore and study; the Junior Highs will have opportunities that week to learn more about Canada's role in the war.
