Time is speeding by faster than I know how to handle; November is here already! There is much to look forward to this month. We will have our Remembrance Day assembly on November 10th and then families will enjoy a 4-day weekend! Staff will be busy planning and writing report cards. Report Cards will go home on the 16th and the evenings of the 17th and the 18th are set aside for parent-teacher interviews. The board plans to be available during parent-teacher interviews should you have any pressing questions or feedback you wish to communicate to them. November 26th will be a literacy day, where students will get to dress up as their favorite storybook characters. Teachers and students are beginning to prepare for our Christmas production; we are praying that we will be able to hold it in person and welcome you once again to celebrate with us. Please pray with us that we will be able to celebrate and gather together! There will also be a society meeting on November 29th, keep your eyes out for more information on that.

I love November for many reasons, but the greatest reason is Remembrance Day. There are many reasons why we should take the time to stop and remember; the Israelites were often told to erect an altar at a location where God had performed a miracle for them. These altars, stone structures, were to act as memorials; reminders to God’s people of what God had done for them. CLASSROOM REMINDERS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

ECS – GRADE 1

Dear parents,

Thank you for your hard work in supporting students with the Reading Challenge. Our classroom reading challenge will continue in November. The November reading log sheets have been sent home in the students' agendas. The same incentive system will apply. If the student reaches 500 minutes of reading in one month, the student will get to keep the snowman.

ECS:

LA: We have been learning about alphabet letters and sounds with the Jolly Phonics program. Please continue to check student's Sound Book in the agenda pocket to review letter sounds with the students at home. Please ask your child to make the sound along with the action for each letter.

Math: We will be learning about the Patterns Unit in November.

Social: We will be starting a unit called My Story. This unit incorporates learning more about self. Please email me your child's place of birth and languages spoken at home to my email address. It is Jocelyn.ahn@hlcacademy.ca. My goal is to create a map to show the different places of birth in our classroom. We are going to learn about our identities as a child of God.

Grade 1:

LA: During in-class guided reading time, students have been reading level E books, with support. Please challenge students to read higher level books at home. Levelled books are available for the students to borrow from the in-class classroom library.

Math: We will be learning about the Patterns Unit in November.

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Science: In October, we wrapped up our Colour Unit. In November, we will be starting a new unit called Building Things. Students will learn to build and make things.

GRADES 2 - 4

Reminders: please ensure your child has a water bottle for class. Also please pack extra forks/spoons for your child as students have been coming without utensils for lunch.

Language Arts: Spelling tests are every Friday, please practice at home with your child. If you need suggestions of how to do that, please let me know. We have begun rotating Literacy Centers every Wednesday where students work on reading, word work, and writing.

Math: Unit 1 for Number Sense has finished for grade 2, they will be moving on to measurement. Grades 3 and 4 are working on addition and subtraction with and without regrouping. This is the last topic in the unit, a test will follow shortly.

Science: We finished our first unit on Rocks and Minerals. Students wrote a science test two weeks ago, which has been corrected and sent home. If you haven't seen this let me know! Our next unit is Testing Materials and Designs.

Social: Focus this month will be on culture and traditions of each of the four countries we are studying.

Bible: the calling of the first disciples, and the link between willingness and obedience.

GRADES 5-6

LA – we are continuing our novel study of *Wonder*; we are going to watch the film after we are finished the book, so please ensure that your students don't watch it while we are reading the book. We are continuing with spelling, the reading challenge, and our word work.

Math – Both grades have started their multiplication unit; the grade 5s will begin looking at various ways of breaking down tougher multiplication into easier multiplication. The grade 6s are learning multi-digit multiplication. Both grades are being tested and

challenged to know their multiplication tables by heart. We are starting with our 10x10s but will move to 12x12s by the end of the year. After completing their units on multiplication both grades will move into division. The goal with knowing their multiplication tables by heart is so that we can begin memorizing the inverse or the division.

Science- we completed our Evidence and Investigation unit and began our Sky Science unit at the end of October. We will be studying space, specifically, the sun, moon, stars, and planets. This will require tasks for homework as we cannot observe the night sky during the day, but hopefully with our days getting shorter the homework can be completed before normal bedtimes.

Social Studies – We are set to complete our first unit, Introduction to Democracy, this week; we will then take a couple of weeks to focus on Remembrance Day. We are excited to receive a World War II museum box sometime this week. We will use this box as the foundation for our focus on remembrance. When we have completed our focus on Remembrance Day, we will begin our next unit, which will focus on Historical Models of Democracy. We will begin with Ancient Athens.

GRADES 7-8

LA – We are continuing our novel study of *The Bronze Bow*; we are covering concepts such as conflict and growth in the main characters, plot structures, as well as examining characters and their growth. The students will be writing a character analysis for their final project. Students are continuing to work towards their reading challenges and weekly grammar lessons; they are also studying vocabulary and tested on them each week. They are asked to use each word in a sentence, with correct usage, punctuation, and grammar.

Math – The grade 7 & 8s are completing their unit on Patterns and Algebra. The grade 7s will begin a Geometry unit after, while the grade 8s will complete a unit on Probability and Data Management and then begin a unit on Geometry.

GRADES 7-9

Social Studies- We are in the middle of our unit on the Renaissance; we are examining what happens when worldviews encounter each other for the first time. Students are learning about what occurred when Renaissance thinkers began studying Greek and Roman texts and how the study of ancient texts influenced

modern thinking. Students will also examine the influence of the Protestant Reformation. During this study, we will take some time out for Remembrance Day and to study the artifacts in the World War II box that will be arriving soon.

Bible- we are currently in the middle of our unit on Theology; students have written excellent paragraphs/essays on their Biblical Worldview of Theology. These have been encouraging to read. Students will be writing their unit test on November 15th after the long weekend; please encourage them to study for this exam. After the 15th we will begin our unit on the Biblical Worldview of Philosophy, how we know what we know and what is truth.
